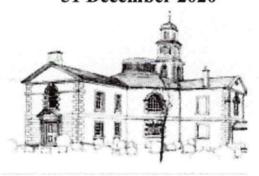

The trustees present their annual report and financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2020. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the General Assembly Regulations for Congregational Finance, the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland published on 16 July 2014.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

Activities engaged in by Hamilton Old Parish Church include Services of Worship, Pastoral Care, Youth and Adult Groups, Christian Education, Social Events and Community Activities.

Achievements and Performance

The Coronavirus issues have had an impact on our activities as a Church, as it has in all walks of life. Fortunately modern technology has allowed us to continue to provide services of worship through online screening and this has also enabled members of our groups and less formal gatherings to keep in touch with each other.

Public Worship & Outreach

During an annual conference the Kirk Session considers progress against the local five-year plan (Local Church Review) and reprioritises activity accordingly. Worship is conducted every Sunday morning, on certain Sunday evenings and on other festival occasions. A less formal family service is held once per month at an earlier time. Services are open to all and everyone is made very welcome. Livestreaming of services began in January to augment the online recordings previously supplied on a dedicated YouTube channel; and a DVD recording continues to be made available for those who are housebound with the requisite technology. The sacraments are administered regularly, and weddings, funerals and services of dedication are held when requested. The Old Parish has a long-established policy of providing spiritual, social and financial support to other Churches, cross denominational, and appropriate charities, both national and international. Members of the congregation are active in a number of social, welfare and educational organisations in the community. These include financial and personnel support for Christian Aid, the Hamilton Drop-in Centre for the homeless and an ecumenical youth project linked to Universal Connections called Hyzone. Several school chaplaincy teams are supported by the Minister, as well as a multi-faith chaplaincy to the local university. The Minister is also Padre to the local Air Training Corp Squadron (RAF Air Cadets).

Church Groups and Organisations

In addition to our services of formal worship the life and mission of Hamilton Old Parish Church is extended and promulgated throughout our Parish and the wider community by the undernoted church organisations which receive support from the Kirk Session and have a liaison elder assigned to each group:

Achievements and Performance (continued)

Sunday Live!

Sunday Live! is the name given to our Sunday School for the ongoing teaching of a Christian education to our young people. Teaching takes place in a happy and relaxed environment by a group of enthusiastic leaders on a rotational basis. Currently there are around twenty children registered. Presently teaching material is taken from Spill the Beans which is in conjunction with the weekly Church Service. Due to the pandemic and children no longer being able to meet face to face, from March, Sunday Live moved onto "Sunday Live from Home". Each week an update is posted on Facebook with the theme and related crafts and activities for the children to undertake if they so wish. Children continued to receive craft packs, back to school packs and selection boxes throughout this time. Looking forward to 2021 plans are in place for Sunday Live to start meeting weekly via Zoom.

Youth Group

A lively youth group is provided for those who have outgrown or progressed beyond the need for Sunday School. A range of activities including sports and film showings is usually enjoyed once a month on Sunday evenings. During lockdown zoom sessions started with 5 young people joining in for a quiz. Open sessions were held throughout the rest of the year with 5-7 members attending to chat over their experiences during lockdown and given an opportunity to discuss anything which was concerning them.

Choir

This has been a challenging year for everyone, with the last service of worship held in the Sanctuary on 15th March, 2020. We were fortunate to be providing livestreaming of services prior to the pandemic, and this has allowed the choral input to continue from the bank of recorded material which we held. Anthems have been used to support the ongoing livestreaming throughout the year. The choral input has been appreciated by many in the congregation and wider community, and this facility has a welcome continuity to the format of worship we would normally have.

It has also been possible to be innovative in supplementing choral input to services where some members have been able to record vocal items from their own home and this has helped to provide additional material during the Christmas season.

Choir membership is currently 22 and although there have been no meetings since March, nevertheless, contact between members has been sustained to support and encourage each other in these difficult days.

We look forward to renewing our fellowship and choral contributions to worship whenever it is safe to do so.

Boys Brigade

The aim is the advancement of Christ's Kingdom amongst boys and the promotion of habits of obedience, reverence, discipline, self-respect and all that tends towards a true Christian manliness. The Company comprises three sections being Anchor Boys, Junior Section and Company Section. The year runs from September to May. Attendance at parade nights is high with all boys participating in award schemes and achievements are recognised at the annual display from initial stages through to President's and Queen's badges. The Company also participates in Battalion competitions and is well represented at the majority of events. Complying with government and Church of Scotland guidelines the boys have been unable to meet for most of the year but look forward to doing so when they can resume their activities.

Achievements and Performance (continued)

Brownies and Girl Guides

The 12th Hamilton Brownie and Guide Company has approximately fourteen girls on the roll and meet weekly on a Tuesday when the girls take part in games, crafts and other fun activities all of which contribute towards appropriate badges. The Company hosted their annual coffee morning following the Thinking Day service on Sunday 23 February 2020 with funds raised going towards the annual census. The pandemic has meant that there have been no meetings since March but contact with the girls has been maintained throughout the year.

Pastoral Care Group

This was started to provide additional support to the Minister and congregation. It has been well received by the congregation with duties including home, hospital and nursing home visits. In the course of these duties members of the wider community are also often offered support and care.

Link Committee

Two events are held in the year, one at Easter and one in the autumn, for members who are over 80 and may find it difficult getting to church services. The Easter service is held in the Church and is organised by the minister and the choir with refreshments following in the North Hall. The autumn event is held in the North Hall and is usually musical entertainment followed by refreshments. Unfortunately, due to the country going into lockdown in March no events were held in 2020.

Old Kirk Dancers

The group meets for two hours on Tuesday evenings beginning at 7.45. Tuition is provided by a qualified member of The Royal Scottish Country Dance Society and new members are always welcome. During the course of the year the group's activities are supplemented by country dance weekends which are always greatly enjoyed by members and which provide an opportunity to meet fellow dancers from all over the country. Classes were suspended in March due to the pandemic.

Guild

The Guild has adopted a 3 year strategy, "One Journey – Many Roads". Last year was "The Extra Mile" Membership stood at 15 before lockdown in March. Members of the committee are keeping in touch with members and look forward to when they can meet again.

The Monday Club

Members of the Monday Club meet in the North Hall every second and fourth Monday from October until the end of March. The main aim of the club is to promote Christian fellowship within the community through educational, recreational, leisure and other activities. The club is open to anyone and membership is currently sixty-five; attendance at meetings averages forty-five. The age group of members ranges from sixty to over ninety. The programme includes speakers on a variety of topics, musical features, quizzes and a yearly outing, usually in the spring. However, this year the coronavirus pandemic brought our sessions to a sudden close and our outing had to be postponed. Committee members have tried to keep in touch with members by phone and offer assistance where needed. Everyone is looking forward to the day when we can all get together again.

Achievements and Performance (continued)

The Saffronhall Singers

Our singing group continues to go from strength to strength and now has 56 members plus the conductor and accompanist. Meetings take place every Monday evening from October till the end of March in the Session Room in the Church halls. The main aim of the group is fellowship and fun through singing, mainly in four-part harmony, an activity that is widely recognised as a strategy to maintain mental well-being. A variety of styles is covered, including sacred, Scottish, modern pop, music from the shows and traditional four-part choral arrangements, which means that there is usually something to suit everyone. During 2020 we were able to give one concert to support fundraising within the community before the coronavirus pandemic brought our meetings to an abrupt halt in March.

Over the next six months members were contacted regularly by telephone and email, thus maintaining the fellowship which is such an important element of our group and, in October, we were able to start meeting via Zoom. The conductor takes the rehearsal using his keyboard, encouraging those listening at home to sing along. Unfortunately, it is not possible to hear each other. Over the summer months accompaniments and individual parts were made available to members using YouTube, enabling individuals to rehearse their own parts, singing along with the conductor. All this has proved highly successful and we have an average online attendance of about 35.

With technical support from our membership and our minister we were able to make an online Carols by Candlelight available using recordings from previous years, which seems to have been well received. The downside is that this was our main fundraising venture! Our funds are now somewhat depleted as we have been purchasing equipment to support our online venture as well as to buy new music to add to our repertoire.

We all look forward to the time when we can meet once more.

Drama Kirk Lanarkshire

We began the year with a dramatized study, the first in the "Calling the Disciples" series, looking at the calling of Andrew, Peter, James and John.

Passion Play rehearsals were well underway when COVID-19 restrictions began.

We were involved in a UK-wide initiative "One Good Friday", performing the same play at the same time in multiple locations. We had worked hard to achieve the large cast required and had fully planned an outdoor performance in Hamilton town centre, as well as a second public performance in a large space in a high school in East Kilbride.

Due to the ban on large gatherings, plans had to be adapted quickly and we filmed a scaled-down studio version of the same play which was broadcast on Good Friday, with a subtitled version then broadcast on Easter Saturday.

As well as screening our own Passion Play, scenes were also used in a documentary on the "One Good Friday" project, alongside interviews with our producer and lead actor. The documentary was viewed by more than 10,000 people.

Achievements and Performance (continued)

Drama Kirk Lanarkshire (continued)

Following this, we adapted the Bible study format so they could take place online. We also increased their frequency. Six studies were presented online over the course of the year and all can be found on YouTube. As restrictions continued, we looked for a way to provide a nativity for young families. "Jerusalem News" was filmed using a small team of professionals and this was made freely available for schools, churches and community groups to use at free-to-attend events during Advent.

Holiday Club

A summer holiday club has been established and is offered for one week in July/August to children from local schools, with attendance from across the town. A combination of crafts, exercise videos, songs, stories and play gives the children the opportunity to socialise and learn in a friendly and safe environment while assisting families with free childcare for a portion of the summer holidays. Given the current circumstances, and to allow our holiday club to continue this year, it moved onto Zoom. This was well received with around twenty five children participating throughout the course of the week.

Film Club

The Film Club continued to give the wider community additional opportunities for social and educational interaction and discussion until we had to close in March due to COVID-19 restrictions.

Leasing to Non-Church Affiliated Clubs and Organisations

Kirk Session recognises the importance of utilising our premises effectively in a cost-efficient manner whilst reaching out to the needs of the wider community. We continued, therefore, with our policy of renting accommodation and car parking spaces to appropriate organisations and this produced a significant income to help fund our running costs.

Hyzone

Hyzone is a relational youth project committed to the needs of young people who choose to engage. They have concern for the development of the whole person and seek to encourage young people to reach their physical, emotional, mental and spiritual potential so that they may find life in all its fullness, whatever form that might take for them. This work is undertaken by a Project Manager and is supported by a sessional team and volunteers. Funding is provided by a secured Grant from the National Lottery Community Fund Young Start Fund and financial contributions from Hamilton Old Parish Church, St John's Church and St Mary's Episcopal. This funding support continues with no penalties in view of the current restrictions although future core funding will be difficult to source but every effort is being made to explore every resource. Small donations also assist and are greatly appreciated. Covid restrictions have impacted as the premises remain closed however Hyzone remains in regular contact with a small core of young people via Instagram and mobile calls. Several walks with young people on Sunday afternoons around the local parks have proved successful but again is dependent on current Covid guidelines. Hyzone will continue to assist and support young people to be positive both about themselves and their future.

Financial Review

The principal source of income remains the offerings of the congregation. Not unexpectedly with services being curtailed in March these fell below recent levels but a number of members amended their payment method to standing orders to ensure that the Church continued to receive their contributions whilst others handed in their freewill offerings. Our total offerings fell marginally short of meeting our Ministry and Mission commitments for the year and with other sources also showing reductions from previous years we had, once again, to dig into reserves to meet expenditure. Our General Fund, which meets all our general running costs showed a deficit of £40,591, before crediting a book gain on the increased value of investments. It looks likely that we may be able to re-open the Church for some form of service in the not-too-distant future and this, allied to a reduction in our largest outgoings, is likely to help in restoring our finances.

We continue to meet in full our assessed Ministry and Mission contributions. These are assessed at 58% of a rolling 3-year average of our unrestricted income and for 2020 amounted to £99,875. This represents a reduction of £3,000 in our original allocation, granted as a result of our support for Hyzone and Drama Kirk. Payment is made to the Church of Scotland trustees by 10 monthly standing order payments between February and November.

Our investment portfolios have remained strong with underlying values increasing, although we did experience a drop in income..

Investment Policy and Performance

Our investment advisers, Rathbones, are instructed to invest both our general funds and our restricted funds within the constraints of a medium to low risk investment portfolio of ethical stocks, thereby prohibiting investment in companies manufacturing armaments, alcohol and tobacco. Within this definition we have a bias towards higher income yielding stock, particularly in times when we are finding it difficult to achieve sufficient income to meet our expenditure.

Certain changes to our portfolios were recommended by Rathbones and these helped to minimise losses and produce growth in the midst of the coronavirus.

The total income return on all our investments was 2.01% (2019: 2.96%).

Risk Management

The principal risks faced by the charity lie in its ability in the medium to longer term to meet normal running costs from a reducing income base and operationally from the ability of the elders and volunteers to carry out their duties effectively for the benefit of vulnerable members of society. The campaign undertaken in 2016 has, for the time being, helped address the first of these and the appointment of new elders in addressing the second.

The age portfolio of the congregation has been increasing in recent years and the minister of the Church continues with the implementation of plans to attract younger attendees which will address the the encompassing problem of longevity.

The operational risk arising from the elders and volunteers carrying out their duties is addressed by regular monitoring of activities and participation in training courses run by the local presbytery or by the National Church.

Risk Management (continued)

Expert advice is taken where required, particularly with regard to the maintenance of our Church building with its Grade 1 listing.

Reserves Policy

The policy of the trustees, particularly recognising the listed status of our buildings, is to hold sufficient reserves in General Funds to ensure that recurring annual costs can be met for the forthcoming year whilst also maintaining funds to meet future contingencies and our obligations as a Church of Scotland charge. We give cognizance to the fact that we have recently been in a period when our income was insufficient to meet our expenditure and, therefore, make provision for future years to ensure the future of the Church. We continue to hold sufficient reserves to comply with this policy.

The Kirk Session also holds restricted funds as detailed in note 15 to the accounts. We comply with all the conditions imposed on the use of these funds.

Stewardship

We continue to follow the guidelines of the Church of Scotland in respect of stewardship. Along with other congregations our plans for 2020 had to be put on hold but these will be reviewed and implemented as soon as circumstances permit.

Structure, Governance and Management

The congregation is a registered charity, number SC010855 and is administered in accordance with the terms of the Deed of Constitution (Unitary Form) and is subject to the Acts and Regulations of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland.

Members of the Kirk Session are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery. Certain responsibilities are delegated to the Finance Committee and the Property Committee as appropriate. The Kirk Session, which meets five times a year, is responsible for spiritual affairs within the church.

Trustees' Responsibilities in Relation to the Financial Statements

The charity trustees are responsible for preparing a trustees' annual report and financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

The law applicable to charities in Scotland requires the charity trustees to prepare financial statements for each year which show a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources, of the charity for that period. In preparing the financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the method and principles in the applicable Charities SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed, subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operational existence.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

The trustees are responsible for the maintenance and integrity of the charity and financial information on the congregation's website. Legislation in the United Kingdom governing the preparation and dissemination of financial statements may differ from legislation in other jurisdictions.

Hamilton Old Parish Church of Scotland Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Hamilton Old Parish Church Year ended 31 December 2020

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2020 which are set out on pages 10 to 23.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended).

The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (a) to (c) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies, which have been applied consistently in the current and preceding year in dealing with items which are considered material to the accounts, are set out below.

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standards applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) issued on 16 July 2014 and the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102), the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended)

Fund accounting

Funds are classified as either restricted funds or unrestricted funds, defined as follows.

Restricted funds are funds subject to specific requirements as to their use which may be declared by the donor or with their authority or created through legal processes, but still within the wider objects of the charity.

Endowment funds are funds which have been given on the condition that the original capital sum is not reduced, but the income there from is used for the purpose defined in accordance with the objects of the charity.

Unrestricted funds are expendable at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the objects of the charity. If parts of the unrestricted funds are earmarked at the discretion of the trustees for a particular purpose, they are designated as a separate fund. This designation has an administrative purpose only and does not legally restrict the trustees' discretion to apply the fund.

Incoming resources

Income is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the item(s) of income have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Donated services and facilities

Donated professional services and donated facilities are recognised as income when the charity has control over the item, any conditions associated with the donated item have been met, the receipt of economic benefit from the use by the charity of the item is probable and that economic benefit can be measured reliably. In accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS102) the general volunteer time of congregation members is not recognised.

On receipt, donated professional services and donated facilities are recognised on the basis of the value of the gift to the charity which is the amount the charity would have been willing to pay to obtain services or facilities of equivalent economic benefit on the open market; a corresponding amount is then recognised as expenditure in the period of receipt.

Interest receivable

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the charity; this is normally upon notification of the interest paid or payable by the Bank.

Accounting Policies (continued)

Fixed Assets

The charity has the right to occupy and use for its charitable objects certain tangible fixed assets, including the Church, halls and manse, vested in the Church of Scotland General Trustees. No consideration is payable for the use of these assets. Expenditure incurred on the repair and maintenance of these assets is charged as resources expended in the Statement of Financial Activities in the period in which the liability arises.

All tangible fixed assets costing in excess of £2,000 having a value to the charity greater than one year, other than those acquired for specific purposes, are capitalised. Depreciation is provided on a straight-line basis to write off the cost or initial value, less residual value, of tangible fixed assets over their estimated useful lives:

Investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at market value at the balance sheet date. Unrealised gains and losses represent the difference between the market value at the beginning and end of the financial year or, if purchased in the year, the difference between cost and market value at the end of the year. Realised gains and losses represent the difference between the proceeds on disposal and the market value at the start of the year or cost if purchased in the year.

Taxation

Hamilton Old Parish Church is recognised as a charity for the purposes of applicable taxation legislation and is therefore not subject to taxation on its charitable activities. The charity is not registered for VAT and resources expended therefore include irrecoverable input VAT.

Purposes of Restricted Funds

The May Orr Bequest is held to help meet expenditure on areas of new work and projects of Hamilton Old Parish Church not associated with its ordinary and recurring expenditure.

The Dick Academic Awards fund is held to provide grant assistance to successful applicants towards the costs of training for the ministry.

The Fabric Fund arose from the proceeds of the sale of the Hamilton North Church manse and is restricted to meet expenditure on the Church buildings and fittings.

The David Gibb Organ Fund is to be used for the repair or replacement of the Church's pipe organ. Other restrictions apply if the trustees should decide against maintaining or replacing the organ

The Stanley Hyslop bequest is to be used for the benefit of the youth of the community.

Other restricted funds represent funds provided to the Church to meet or assist in meeting specified items or categories of expenditure.

Purposes of Designated Funds

The Blackwood Bequest is designated for assisting in meeting expenditure relating to music in the Church.

Other designated funds are for use by the group or organization referred to.
