Dear friends,

What are you eating? Do you try to eat fresh seasonal fruit and vegetables, or do the all-year-round varieties that the Supermarkets provide make it difficult to know when is the best time to eat certain things? I definitely prefer the taste of a Summer strawberry, to those we see in the winter, whether they accompany Wimbledon or not.

Similarly, what do you like to consume, spiritually? Do you like to follow the seasons of the Christian year, with Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, and then Trinity or "Ordinary" time, all the way through to Christ the King Sunday, at the end of November? Do you enjoy Harvest Thanksgiving, dedication services, and other occasions? Do we have a routine for the staples of bible reading and prayer?

I am delighted that we have returned to the New Testament for our Bible Reading Challenge, and I have attempted to mingle the Gospels and Letters, so it doesn't feel stale. I am also delighted to be preaching about bible characters and significant stories, which takes out of the cookbook of the Revised Common Lectionary (RCL) that many churches follow. Instead, we have been looking at some of the characters that we may have rarely seen since Sunday School. How do these stories taste, now, with more experienced taste buds?

The basic ingredients of a spiritual life have not changed. So, sometimes we need to prepare them in new and exciting ways. Sometimes, this works for us. Other times we might push things around our plate with a little bemusement. But I trust that together we will be nourished and will help each other digest what life might serve us, in the church and out of the church. Surely that is one of the strengths of church, that it has it's seasons, and we have company while we eat. Bon appetite!

Drama Kirk Bible Studies - "Calling the Disciples"

Drama Kirk has developed a series of interactive bible studies, where the focus is not on performing but rather on learning more about scripture together, using drama tools. The evenings are fun and informal and provide a completely new way to engage with scripture. As we embody the great characters of scripture, we draw closer to them and often deepen our understanding of their experience.

Throughout 2020, our studies will be a series "Calling the Disciples" when we will look at how Jesus called his disciples – not just the original 12 but also those who followed them, and the women who were so much a part of the early church.

We can also reflect on our own calling to follow Jesus through these sessions. Even when we see ourselves as weak or foolish, we have been chosen by our God. As I prepare these sessions, I am much reassured by 1 Corinthians 1: 26 - 28, which tells us:-

"For you see your calling, brethren, that not many wise according to the flesh, not many mighty, not many noble are called. But God has chosen the foolish things of the world and put to shame the wise, and God has chosen the weak things of the world and put to shame things which are mighty; and the base things of the world and the things which are despised God has chosen."

So please do join us as we explore these themes and understand afresh the calling of the fishermen. In our first study, we will consider the calling of Peter, Andrew, James and John. You may find it helpful to read Luke 4 & 5 in advance. However; feel free to simply turn up on the night and enjoy!

Finance

At the time of writing, the 2019 accounts are being finalised and will be presented to the Trustees on 10th March for approval. The date of the Annual Stated Meeting is 29th March when a full report will be given to the congregation.

The Gift Aid claim for 2019 has been submitted and paid by HMRC. The total gift aided income was $\pounds 90,464.08$ which gave us a refund of tax amounting to $\pounds 22,616.02$. This is a drop from last year with the loss of members outweighing increases in giving.
